Mr. Payne introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Ways and Means and ordered to be printed.

A BILL

To extend the laws relating to customs and internal revenue over the island of Puerto Rico ceded to the United States.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3	That the laws of the United States relating to customs and
4	internal revenue, including those relating to the punishment
5	for crimes in connection with the enforcement of said laws,
6	are hereby extended to and over the island of Puerto Rico and
7	all adjacent islands and waters of the islands ceded to the
8	United States by the Government of Spain by treaty con-
9	cluded April eleventh, eighteen hundred and ninety-nine, so
10	far as such laws may be applicable.
11	SEC. 2. That there shall be in the ceded island one cus-
12	toms collection district, as follows: The district of Puerto Rico,
13	to comprise all the islands ceded, as aforesaid, in which San
14	Juan shall be the port of entry, and Ponce, Mayaguez, Are-
15	cibo, Aguadilla, Arroyo, and Ilumacao subports of entry; and

- 1 there shall be in said collection district a collector of customs,
- 2 who shall reside at San Juan, and shall receive an annual
- 3 salary of four thousand dollars.
- 4 Customs officers shall be stationed at said subports, with
- 5 authority to enter and clear vessels, receive duties, fees, and
- 6 other moneys, and perform such other service as is provided
- 7 by law, and they shall receive such compensation as the Sec-
- 8 retary of the Treasury may deem just and reasonable.
- 9 SEC. 3. That the President of the United States is hereby
- 10 authorized to establish an internal-revenue collection district
- 11 to embrace all the said islands, or in his discretion to annex
- 12 said islands to some other internal-revenue collection district
- 13 of the United States.
