Mr. O'MAHONEY (for himself and Mr. BUTLER) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Interior and Insular Affairs

A BILL

To provide for the organization of a constitutional government by the people of Puerto Rico.

- Whereas the Congress of the United States by a series of enactments has progressively recognized the right of self-government of the people of Puerto Rico; and
- Whereas under the terms of these congressional enactments an increasingly large measure of self-government has been achieved: Therefore
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, 3 That, fully recognizing the principle of government by con-4 sent, this Act is now adopted in the nature of a compact

so that the people of Puerto Rico may organize a govern ment pursuant to a constitution of their own adoption.

3 SEC. 2. Upon acceptance of this Act by the people 4 of Puerto Rico, they are hereby authorized to call a con-5 stitutional convention to form a constitution in accordance 6 with procedures prescribed by the laws of Puerto Rico. 7 The constitution shall create a government republican in 8 form and shall include a bill of rights.

9 SEC. 3. Upon adoption of the constitution by the people 10 of Puerto Rico, the President of the United States is author-11 ized to transmit such constitution to the Congress of the 12 United States if he finds that such constitution conforms 13 with the applicable provisions of this Act and of the Con-14 stitution of the United States.

Upon approval of such constitution by the Congress, or upon the expiration of the congressional session during which the constitution is transmitted, provided transmittal occurs not later than ninety days before adjournment, if the Congress has not disapproved such constitution, the constitution shall be deemed approved and shall become effective in accordance with its terms.

SEC. 4. Except as provided in section 5 of this Act,
the Act entitled "An Act to provide a civil government
for Puerto Rico, and for other purposes", approved March
25 2, 1917, as amended, is hereby continued in force and effect

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and it shall hereafter be referred to as the "Puerto Rican
 Federal Relations Act".

3 SEC. 5. The President of the United States, when re-4 quested by legislative enactment of the government of 5 Puerto Rico, may except Puerto Rico from the application 6 of any Federal law, not specifically made applicable to 7 Puerto Rico by Congress, which he deems inapplicable by 8 reason of local conditions.

9 SEC. 6. At such time as the constitution of Puerto Rico
10 becomes effective, the following provisions of such Act of
11 March 2, 1917, as amended, shall be deemed repealed:

23 SEC. 7. All laws or parts of laws inconsistent with this
 24 Act are hereby repealed.

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SEC. 2. This Act shall be submitted to the qualified voters

of Puerto Rico for acceptance or rejection through an island-1 wide referendum to be held in accordance with the laws of $\mathbf{2}$ Puerto Rico. Upon the approval of this Act, by a majority 3 of the voters participating in such referendum, the Legisla-4 ture of Puerto Rico is authorized to call a constitutional 5 convention to draft a constitution for the said island of 6 Puerto Rico. The said constitution shall provide a republican 7 8 form of government and shall include a bill of rights.

9 SEC. 3. Upon adoption of the constitution by the people 10 of Puerto Rico, the President of the United States is au-11 thorized to transmit such constitution to the Congress of the 12 United States if he finds that such constitution conforms with 13 the applicable provisions of this Act and of the Constitution 14 of the United States.

15 Upon approval by the Congress the constitution shall
16 become effective in accordance with its terms.

SEC. 4. Except as provided in section 5 of this Act, the
Act entitled "An Act to provide a civil government for Porto
Rico, and for other purposes", approved March 2, 1917, as
amended, is hereby continued in force and effect and may
hereafter be cited as the "Puerto Rican Federal Relations
Act".

SFG. 5. At such time as the constitution of Puerto Rico
 becomes effective, the following provisions of such Act of
 March 2, 1917, as amended, shall be deemed repealed:
