## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Relating to self-determination for the people of Puerto Rico.

- Whereas the people of Puerto Rico freely chose the present form of their association with the United States in a popular referendum in 1952; and
- Whereas successive United States administrations since that time have continued to be publicly committed to the fundamental principle of self-determination for the people of Puerto Rico; and
- Whereas certain other governments lacking in a clear understanding of the United States relationship with Puerto Rico have questioned the status of Puerto Rico and the extent to which its citizens enjoy the right to self-determination: Now, therefore, be it

- 2 concurring), That the Congress takes this opportunity to
- 3 reaffirm its commitment to respect and support the right of
- 4 the people of Puerto Rico to determine their own political
- 5 future and to change their relationship with the United States
- 6 through a peaceful, open, and democratic process.
